Canvass of  
election returns

On motion of Supervisor Mason, duly seconded by Supervisor Holcomb, and carried unanimously, the Board of Supervisors approves release of the tax bond posted for Subdivision Tract No. 3381.

The returns of the special election held November 29th within the area of proposed Chino Basin Water Conservation District are canvassed by the Board of Supervisors at this time. The Board thereupon acts to complete the District's formation and organization, as follows:

(do) On motion of Supervisor Mason, seconded by Supervisor Holcomb, the following resolution is adopted and order made:

WHEREAS, a petition in writing having been duly presented to and filed with this Board, at a regular meeting of this Board, held on the 17th day of October 1949, proposing the formation of the Chino Basin Water Conservation District within the boundaries hereinafter described, pursuant to the provisions of the Water Conservation Act of 1931, (Statutes 1931, p. 2045 as amended; Deering's General Laws Act 9127c); and

WHEREAS, said petition was published prior to the hearing for the time and in the manner required by law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said act this Board designated the name of the district to be, and the same shall for all purposes hereafter be known as "Chino Basin Water Conservation District"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said act this Board, by resolution duly adopted on October 24, 1949, ordered that an election be held on November 29, 1949, within the boundaries hereinafter described for the formation of said district and for the election of seven directors, one from each division as set forth in said resolution; and

WHEREAS, an election was held within said proposed Chino Basin Water Conservation District on Tuesday, November 29, 1949, in accordance with resolution and proclamation of this Board; and

WHEREAS, the election officers serving at said election duly certified the returns of said election to this Board; and

WHEREAS, this Board duly canvassed the said returns of said election which show that 1039 votes were cast for the formation of said district and 76 votes were cast against the formation of said district; and

WHEREAS, notice of said election in the manner and for the time required by law was given by publication; and

WHEREAS, it appears to the satisfaction of this Board that said election was duly held at the time and at the places specified, and in accordance with law, as shown by the election returns of said election officers as presented to this Board; and

WHEREAS, this Board has this date made an official canvass of said election as required by law;

NOW THEREFORE, the Board hereby finds and declares that there were 1,115 votes cast at said election with the following results:

and the Board hereby finds and declares in accordance with said official canvass Harold Stewart, Richard G. Manley, E. L. Keechler, Goldie E. McQuatters, Ernest Soper, Austin B. Gates, and Charles T. Merrill be and they are hereby declared elected as Directors of the Chino Basin Water Conservation District, and the Clerk is instructed to issue Certificates of Election in accordance therewith;

**IT IS FURTHER FOUND, DECLARED AND ORDERED, that in accordance with said official canvass, said district was duly formed and organized and that all of the following described territory be and the same is hereby formed, organized and incorporated into a water conservation district to be known as Chino Basin Water Conservation District, to-wit:**

Beginning at the intersection of the south line of Section 3, T. 1 S., R. 8 W., S.B.B. & M., San Bernardino County, State of California, and the boundary line between San Bernardino and Los Angeles Counties; thence east along section lines to the southwest corner of the east 1/2 of Section 2, same township and range; thence north along the west line of the east 1/2 of said Section 2 to the northwest corner thereof; thence east along the San Bernardino Base Line to an intersection with the center line of Wilson Avenue, as shown on plat of the Revised Map of the Hurin Tract, as recorded in Map Book 17, page 82, Records of said County; thence north along the center line of said Wilson Avenue to an intersection with the north line of Block 5 of aforesaid tract extended west; thence east along the north line of said Block 5 to the northeast corner thereof; thence south along the east line of said Block 5 to the northwest corner of Lot 21, Upland Foothill Tract, as recorded in Map Book 18, page 76, Records of said County; thence east along the north line of said Lot 21 and along the extension of said line to an intersection of the center line of Mountain Avenue; thence north along the center line of said Mountain Avenue, being along the west corporate limits of the City of Upland, to its intersection with the center line of 20th Street in the City of Upland; thence east along the center line of said 20th Street to its intersection with the center line of Campus Avenue in the City of Upland; thence south along the center line of said Campus Avenue to an intersection with the center line of 16th Street, also known as Base Line Street; thence east along the center line of said 16th Street to an intersection with the east line of Lot 419 extended northerly of Ontario Colony Lands, as recorded in Map Book 11, page 6, Records of said County; thence south along the east line of said Lot 419 and along the east line of Lots 444, 445, 470, 471, 496, 497 and 522 of aforesaid Ontario Colony Lands and said line extended to an intersection with the center line of Foothill Blvd.; thence easterly along the center line of said Foothill Blvd., to an intersection with the center line of Vineyard Avenue, as shown on map of Cucamonga Vineyards Tract, Subdivision "B", as recorded in Map Book 20, page 45, Records of said County; thence north along the center line of said Vineyard Avenue to an intersection with the center line of San Bernardino Avenue; thence easterly along the center line of said San Bernardino Avenue to an intersection with the center line of Hellman Avenue; thence north along the center line of said Hellman Avenue to an intersection with the center line of Church Street; thence easterly along the center line of said Church Street to an intersection with the center line of Archibald Avenue; thence north along the center line of said Archibald

Avenue to an intersection with the center line of Base Line Street; thence east along the center line of said Base Line Street to an intersection with the center line of Hermosa Avenue; thence north along the center line of said Hermosa Avenue to an intersection with the center line of 19th Street, also known as Olive Street; thence east along the center line of said 19th Street to an intersection with the center line of Haven Avenue; thence north along the center line of said Haven Avenue to an intersection with the center line of Highland Avenue; thence east along the center line of said Highland Avenue to the northeast corner of Section 36, T. 1 N., R. 7 W., S.B.B. & M.; thence south along the range line between ranges 6 and 7 west to the southeast corner of Section 36, T. 1 S., R. 7 W.; said point being on the boundary line between San Bernardino and Riverside Counties; thence south, southwesterly, south and west along said county boundary line to the center of Section 7, T. 3 S., R. 7 W.; thence north to the north 1/4 corner of said Section 7; thence west to the northwest corner of said Section 7; thence north to the northeast corner of the southeast 1/4 of the southeast 1/4 of Section 1, T. 3 S., R. 8 W.; thence west to the northwest corner of the southeast 1/4 of the southeast 1/4 of said Section 1; thence north to the northwest corner of the southeast 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 of said Section 1; thence west to the southwest corner of the east 1/2 of Government Lot 2 of the north 1/2 of the northwest 1/4 of said Section 1; thence north to the northwest corner of the east 1/2 of said Government Lot 2; thence west along township line between townships 2 and 3 south to the southwest corner of the southeast 1/4 of Section 35, T. 2 S., R. 8 W.; thence north to the center of said Section 35; thence west to the southwest corner of the northwest 1/4 of said Section 35; thence north to the northwest corner of said Section 35; thence west along section line to the southwest corner of the east 1/2 of Section 27, unsurveyed, lying within the Rancho Santa Ana Del Chino, as recorded in Map Book 1, page 12, Records of said County, and being a portion of Government Lot 37, T. 2 S., R. 8 W.; thence north along the west line of the east 1/2 of said Section 27 to an intersection with the southerly line of Tract No. 2650, as recorded in Map Book 37, pages 69 to 72, inclusive, of said County; thence westerly following the southerly boundary line of said Tract No. 2650 to an intersection of said line with the west line of aforesaid Section 27; thence south along said Section line to an intersection with the center line of Soquel Canyon Road as shown on map of Tract No. 2140, recorded in Map Book 34, page 61, Records of said County; thence westerly along the center line of said Soquel Canyon Road to an intersection of the west line of Lot 3 of said Tract extended southerly; thence north along the west line of said Lot 3 and Lots 2 and 1 of said Tract and along the extension of said line to an intersection with the center line of Carbon Canyon Road; thence westerly along the center line of said Carbon Canyon Road to an intersection with the center line of Peyton Road; thence north and easterly along the center line of said Peyton Road to an intersection with the center line of Garey Avenue (State Highway); thence northwesterly along the center line of said Garey Avenue to an intersection of said line with the boundary line between San Bernardino and Los Angeles Counties; thence easterly and northeasterly along said county boundary line to the intersection of the south line of aforesaid Section 3, T. 1 S., R. 8 W., S.B.B. & M., being the point of beginning.
